Dear St. John's Members and Friends,

Happy Epiphany!

(Wait a minute. Why not the usual Happy New Year? And what's "Epiphany"?)

I'll start with the first question. Given the current social, political, and economic conditions around the world, yeah, it's not going to be a "happy" year.

(So, then, what type of year do you think it will be?)

Well, let me first answer your second question – What is Epiphany? That word, epiphany, means "a sudden insight or intuitive understanding" or "a revelatory manifestation of a divine being" (*American Heritage Dictionary*). For the Church, Epiphany is a holy day as well as a church season. Epiphany Day marks the celebration of the visitation of the Magi (the three wisemen). The season of Epiphany marks the time when the Church lessons focus on the revealing of Jesus as the Messiah, the Son of God.

(Okay. I guess I get all that... though it was a little boring. But again, I want to know – what type of year do you think 2025 will be if not "happy"?)

Realistically, based on the economic stats and the political tensions around the world, I think 2025 is going to be a difficult one for most of us. And, specifically for the Church, I think 2025 will be a time of reflection which hopefully will lead to repentance and a return to the Church's true purpose – the proclamation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

(What do you mean? Are you saying that the Church has not done this?)

Over the past 35 years as a pastor, I have noticed more and more the Church in the West substituting other "gospels" for Jesus's message. This, I believe, has led to the Church becoming adrift in the waters of culture rather than in the baptismal waters of the Holy Spirit. But I also believe that God is setting up a moment – which may occur in 2025, perhaps later – when the Church repents of its current path and turns back to the Gospel Message, the message that gives the Church its breath, its life, its purpose, its direction.

So, do I think 2025 will be a tough year for society and for the Church? Yes, I do. But it also can become the year of renewal. It could very much be a year like 1517. But that can only when the Church confesses it cannot change direction except by the grace of God.

Think about it. Pray about it. Act on it.


And, a blessed Epiphany to you all!
