Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

It's June and we anticipate the welcome change of season. We pray for ample rain and sun benefiting the growing crops and we ask our Lord for an abundant harvest.

This June (June 8) we celebrate the Festival of Pentecost. It calls to remembrance the gift of the Holy Spirit as tongues of fire rained down on the disciples (followers) and as the winds of change blew and the Spirit created apostles (sent by God).

We receive the Holy Spirit in baptism so that we might become both disciples and apostles. We are called to follow and to learn. We are also sent to share the love of Jesus to all – locally and globally through words and actions.

The monthly Northern Illinois Synod zoom meeting for all call committees in the synod was held May 19, 2025. Pastor Jen Beamsley opened with prayer. She had great news for our synod. Six congregations will be voting on new pastors by the end of June

10 congregations are interviewing candidates. 5 are fulltime pastor calls, 4 are part time calls and one is maybe part time, maybe fulltime. This tells us there is a lot of interest by candidates in coming to our synod.

There are five new congregations just starting the call process. They are just

putting together their call committees.

More pastors with nineteen years or more of experience are submitting paperwork for a new call. This limits the number of congregations who can afford to call these pastors.

Please keep all candidates, congregations in the call process and seminarians in your prayers.
