Dear Friends and Disciples of St. John's,

I pray that you will have a safe, restful and celebration this Independence Day weekend as we celebrate the freedom we all cherish and that is guaranteed by the constitution and the Bill of Rights.

As some of you know the council has established a special committee that has been asked to help us focus on our ministry to children, youth, young adults and young families.

One of the topics that we have been discussing is how we might include younger children in Holy Communion. To begin this conversation, I have provided some guidance on this topic from our ELCA statement titled "The Use of the Means of Grace." Although this statement talks about all the Means of Grace, Word, Baptism and Holy Communion, I have below quoted a section just on the topic:

Admission to the Sacrament is by invitation of the Lord, presented through the Church to those who are baptized.

When adults and older children are baptized, they may be communed for the first time in the service in which they are baptized. Baptismal preparation and continuing instruction for Holy Communion.

Customs vary on the age and circumstances for admission to the Lord's Supper. The age for communing children continues to be discussed and reviewed in our congregations. When "A Report on the Study of Confirmation and First Communion" was adopted, a majority of congregations now in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America separated confirmation and reception of Holy Communion and began inviting children to commune in the fifth grade. Since that time a number of congregations have continued to lower the age of communion, especially for school age children. Although A Statement on Communion Practices precluded the communion of infants, members and congregations have become aware of this practice in some congregations of this church, in historical studies of the early centuries of the Church, in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada, and in broader ecumenical discussion.

Baptized children begin to commune on a regular basis at a time determined through mutual conversation that includes the pastor, the child, and the parents or sponsors involved, within the accepted practice s of the congregation. Ordinarily this beginning will occur only when children can eat and drink and can start to respond to the gift of Christ in the Supper.

At this time, we have younger children communing because they were received in a previous congregation to the Lord's Table. Others have been prepared though preparation by a previous pastor. I believe that it would be good practice to follow the above guideline and have parents and child(ren) meet with the pastor to determine through study and conversation a child's readiness for communion. All of us receive communion by faith and not by understanding the mystery of Christ's body and blood comes to us in, with and under the bread and wine. So, if there are parents who desire to explore communion for their children, I invite you to make an appointment and visit with me.

We will continue to explore how to best serve the spiritual and faith formation needs of our children.

The 2025 Synod Assembly was held June 13th and 14th at Augustana College. Actions taken included the blessing of the new synod paraments (a thanks to the 38 congregations who pieced together quilt blocks), heard from Deacon Jessica Noonan from LEAD Connects about learning from our neighbors, passed the Fiscal Year 2027 Northern Illinois Synod Budget, passed the 2026 Rostered Minister Compensation Guidelines, elected several members to serve on the Synod Council and synod committees, heard from Bishop Fidlar about discovering our why, heard from Ms. Becca Payne and Mrs. Rahel Mwitula Williams from the ELCA, blessed those who will be voting member a the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly, celebrated our Rostered Minister ordination anniversaries (including Pastor Len celebrating 50 years) and remembered our Rostered Ministers who died in the last year.



Two resolutions that were passed by the assembly included R-1: Resolution for National Day of Remembrance for Indian Boarding School and R-2: Northern Illinois Synod to Be a Reconciling in Christ Synod.

Thank you to Gertrude Heimerdinger and Grace Heimerdinger-Baake for attending the assembly and representing St. John's. Thanks also to Leann Heimerdinger for attending and voting as a member of the Synod council.

The social ministry committee would like to thank everyone for their generous contributions to the ELCA Good Gifts project. Our goal was set at \$1245, but we received \$2526.97 in contributions. We doubled the amount we purchased in each category and put the leftover amount in the "most needed" category. Thank you once again to everyone that supported this very important project.
